



Guidance for abstract submission 2026

Conference theme –Guardians of the Veins

Abstracts should align with the conference theme:

Commitment to excellence in infusion practices, linked to one of the IVNNZ matapono (values):

- Patient centred care
- Professionalism
- Collaboration
- Innovation
- Diversity and inclusion
- Sustainability

Formatting requirements - Please ensure your abstract meets the following criteria:

- Maximum 300 words (excluding title, author names, and affiliations)
- Submit via the online text box only
- Deadline: midnight NZST, 8 July 2026
- Use sentence case for the title (do not use all capital letters or full stops)
- Do not include degrees or professional titles
- Avoid abbreviations unless they are defined within the abstract
- Ensure clear, concise, and grammatically correct English
- Do not include tables, graphs, or images

Abstract structure - Abstracts should follow this recommended format:

- Title - A concise and descriptive title reflecting the study
- Introduction - Provide background and rationale for the study
- Clearly state the aim(s)
- Methods
- Briefly describe:
 - Study design (for example, audit, research, or case study)
 - Population or sample
 - Data collection and analysis

Results

- Present key findings
- Include important statistical results where applicable

Conclusions

- Summarise key outcomes
- Ensure conclusions are supported by the results

Submission process

- Abstracts must be submitted via email to info@ivnnz.co.nz Attn: Secretary - ABSTRACT
- A confirmation email will be sent upon successful submission
- You may edit your abstract at any time before the deadline

Review process

- All abstracts will be reviewed by the IVNNZ Executive Committee
- Outcomes will be communicated via email to the submitting author
- Some abstracts may require revision; authors may be asked to resubmit
- The revision process is intended to support and strengthen submissions

Important notes

- Abstracts cannot be edited after the submission deadline
- Presenters must register to confirm participation
- Failure to register may result in removal from the programme
